Accepted papers will be **published online as well as in printed versions**

Paper acceptance/rejection notification: 5 -28 days after submission

Publication Due: June - 2018 (for volume 2 -Issue 2 June-2018)

Submission Instructions

Note: Submissions that fail to meet the stipulated guidelines will not be accepted.

The following should be noted by those wishing to submit their articles or research report to this journal:

a) General guideline

- The paper must be in English language.
- There are no fees charged for publishing in CARJER.
- Only papers that will be sent to the chief editor via the email will be considered.
- Articles that have appeared in other journals and/or under consideration to be published elsewhere should not be sent to CARJER.

- Before sending an article or research paper for publication into CARJER please ensure that your article or research report does not contain work taken from other sources without the appropriate acknowledgment. All articles and research reports will be checked for originality using ‘Turnitin’ software.
- Refereed research articles should be between 3000 – 8000 words in length, descriptive research reports should not be less than 10,000 words and not more than 45000, and descriptive articles and case studies should be 2500-5000 words.
- Submissions can be in Microsoft word.doc, RTF, or equivalent open source Document file format.

b) Formatting information

- Use simple formatting “bold” or italic. No styles
- Use Arial 12-point font for the Title, in bold case and **NOT** all in CAPITALS
- Use Arial 10 point font for the remainder of your article or research report
- Use single spacing throughout. Use for a space between paragraphs. No indentation of the first line of paragraph.
- First level headline should be in bold upper case, and second level headings in bold upper and lower case
- No footnotes- instead use endnote
- Tables, figures and other diagrams should be put within the main text, and not at the back of the article or research report.

c) Author(s)’ name(s)

Provide all the authors’ names in their correct order on the article. Author(s) short biography (very short-100 word) is encouraged. This should include the name, rank, institution, institutional address, and email address.

d) Abstract

Provide an abstract of approximately 200-250 words.

e) Reference style

References should be in APA style (version 8). They should relate only to materials cited within the manuscript and be listed in alphabetical order, including the author(s)’ name(s), complete title of the cited work, title of the source, volume, issue, year of publication, and pages cited- (for sources from published articles or research reports). For books: the author(s)’ name(s), complete title of the cited work, city of publication, and name of publisher.
